General

This Privacy Statement regulates the processing of your personal data as part of the ICNE 2021 Virtual Conference when you visit the virtual platform. These processing activities are always carried out by ICNE as the controller, located c/o Mazurkas Travel Sp. Z o.o.

ICNE is continuously committed to protecting the privacy of all data subjects as much as possible. In this Privacy Statement you will find everything you need to know to better understand how ICNE collects and processes your personal data and to understand the choices you have to protect your personal data.

Protecting personal data is very important to ICNE. That is why we take every effort to ensure the level of data protection & information security and that we act in accordance with the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) whenever we process your personal data.

More specifically, ICNE will always treat personal data lawfully for specified purposes. We will never ask for more personal data than is necessary or keep these personal data longer than necessary. Finally, ICNE will take the technical and organizational measures to ensure that your personal information is secure.

1 Personal data

According to current legislation, personal data means any information relating to an identified or identifiable natural person ('data subject'); an identifiable natural person is one who can be identified, directly or indirectly, in particular by reference to an identifier such as a name, an identification number, location data, an online identifier or to one or more factors specific to the physical, physiological, genetic, mental, economic, cultural or social identity of that natural person.

The processing of personal data means any operation or set of operations which is performed on personal data or on sets of personal data, whether or not by automated means, such as collection, recording, organization, structuring, storage,



adaptation or alteration, retrieval, consultation, use, disclosure by transmission, dissemination or otherwise making available, alignment or combination, restriction, erasure or destruction.

Examples of personal data are name, address or e-mail address, but this also includes your IP

1.1 What personal data do we process?

ICNE is using Provirtualmeeting as provider of the ICNE 2021 virtual conference platform to process your personal data as an attendee. ICNE will always process your personal data when you visit the platform in order to guarantee the performance and security of the platform at all times. If you don't log in or register, no additional personal data will be processed.

If the attendee logs in on the platform, ICNE will additionally process the following personal data:

- Identification data (first name, last name);
- Contact information (email address);
- institution/company, city, country, registration type, professional category and password

No additional personal data will be processed on the platform, except for the information you provide us to receive a specific service.

1.2 Why do we process your personal data?

We process your personal data for various reasons:

1.2.1 Attend the digital meeting

ICNE is processing your personal data to allow you to register and log in on the virtual platform. This processing of personal data is necessary for the agreement between ICNE and you as an attendee. Without the processing of personal data, it is not possible to provide you with the desired services and to finalize your registration and/or your log in on the ICNE 2021 virtual platform.

1.2.2 Performance & security of the platform

Some personal data is being processed to guarantee an error free provision of the virtual conference platform. Other data may be used to analyze some user patterns on this platform (country of origin for ex. or professional category). In that case, your personal data is not related to your identification data (first name, last name) and is handled anonymously.

1.2.3 Certificate of attendance

A Certificate of Attendance for all regular delegates will be available after the ICNE 2021 Virtual Conference.



1.2.4 Digital Leadcapture

By agreeing to the terms of use, you agree to being tracked for nominative and non-nominative analytics used by the ICNE 2021 Conference Organizers:

- Non-nominative tracking data may include profession, organization, department, city, country, etc.
- Nominative data are: Title, First Name, Last Name, Profession, Institution, City, Country, Email address.

Clicking on PLAY on every single industry satellite symposium or workshop or entering a booth indicates your consent to share your nominative data with the industry partner who is hosting this session. Your personal data is processed in strict compliance with the legal requirements: should you not consent to share your nominative data, please contact info@ianeurology.org to communicate your disagreement.

On certain sections of this site your nominative data (e.g. your first and last name) could be shown to others (e.g. in the chat or in the sender field of an Email sent by you to an author) and by using certain features you agree to such. At certain points you may be prompted to share your nominative and contact information (e.g. email) with third parties which you can agree to, or decline.

1.2.5 Newsletters and interesting communications

We believe it is very important to have good relationships and communication with all visitors and attendees. Therefore, we shall contact you to keep you informed of relevant information concerning ICNE and/or its virtual conference. For the processing of personal data under this activity, ICNE shall use its legitimate interest. You may at any time notify us that you no longer wish to receive these communications.

1.3 Do we transfer your personal data to third parties?

Your personal data is processed for purposes that ICNE determines in accordance with its communication activities. To manage the platform, ICNE uses Mazurkas travel Sp. Z o.o- as its processor. Under no circumstances will the processor process your personal data for its own purposes.

Should the processor have received no disagreement Email from your part (info@ianeurology.org) as per § 1.2.4 , then it is understood that you have given your consent to share your personal data with the industry partners. Following nominative data will be shared: Title, First Name, Last Name, Profession, Institution, City, Country, Email address.



1.4 How long do we keep your personal data?

ICNE will not retain your personal data longer than necessary for the aforementioned purposes. If the visitor/attendee wishes to delete his/her account, his/her personal data collected for the virtual event will be deleted immediately.

2 What rights do you have and how can you exercise them?

2.1 Access to your personal data

You have the right to access all personal data that we process concerning your person. You may also receive a copy of this data, which we shall send to you on paper or digitally. You can request this by sending an email to mailto:

2.2 Rectification of your personal data

You have the right to request that we rectify your personal data if they are incorrect or incomplete. You may also request that we temporarily stop using your personal data until they are rectified or completed. You can request this by sending an email to info@ianeurology.org

Withdrawing your consent

You have the right to withdraw your consent at any time. You can request this by sending an email to info@ianeurology.org

2.3 Erasure of your personal data

You have the right to request the erasure of your personal data in case they are no longer required for the purposes of this Privacy Policy or if you withdraw your consent to the processing. You can request this by sending an email to info@ianeurology.org

Attention: We are not obliged to erase your personal data if we are required or permitted to retain them on the grounds of a legal obligation.

2.4 Data portability of your personal data.

You have the right to receive your personal data in a universally readable format such as a text file or other digital file.

2.5 Objection to the processing of your personal data.

If you feel that we are not using your personal data in an appropriate manner, you may object to such processing operations, for example where such processing is carried out for purposes relating to newsletters, marketing, or other processing operations that are not required in the context of our professional relationship. 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2.6 Lodging a complaint with the supervisory authority

If you are not satisfied with the manner in which your personal data is processed, you may lodge a complaint with the competent data protection authority.
